When Sarah McGhie opened the door to her classic Victorian home on Masonic Avenue, it was immediately apparent why she's labeled a "superhost" on Airbnb. As her fluffy Australian shepherd Boo trotted beside her, she wasted no time in offering a glass of water from her immaculate remodeled kitchen, which looks out onto a manicured backyard; there, a separate entrance leads to the ground-floor "garden retreat" she rents for about \$200 a night. The unit was occupied by a guest, one of at least 404 who have stayed with McGhie since 2015. McGhie rents out her home to help pay her property taxes, but "it's not passive income," she said. "People at the beginning of Airbnb remember the whole thing was, feel like a local when you travel, and they really wanted the host interaction." Nowadays, some guests would prefer to be left alone, but many don't; "I don't think it would work if you were an introvert who didn't like people." McGhie's home sits in the middle of the Haight-Ashbury, the leafy, mural-and-tie-dye-filled neighborhood that helped usher in the hippie movement and put San Francisco on the U.S. cultural map. Save for downtown, her part of Haight-Ashbury has more active short-term Airbnb listings than any other neighborhood in the city, according to data collected by advocacy group Inside Airbnb and analyzed by The Chronicle. The data showed that there were 56 listings within less than a half square mile. To pinpoint the Haight as the top residential Airbnb neighborhood, The Chronicle used Inside Airbnb's listings data and methodology to determine whether each listing was "active" — that is, whether it had an estimated occupancy rate of 25% or more — and whether it was short-term, meaning it had a minimum stay of fewer than 30 days. We then used the listings' latitude and longitude coordinates to divide the city into more than 140 square regions to find the ones with the greatest concentrations of active, short-term listings. Of San Francisco's 6,444 Airbnb listings as of June 3, 3,246 are "short-term" rentals. About 6 in 10 of these short-term rentals were "active." Although many of these listings are clustered downtown, there are also a number of less densely populated, home-heavy neighborhoods with large numbers of Airbnbs. In addition to Haight-Ashbury, the Castro and Dolores Heights also had unusually high Airbnb concentration levels. Some residents say the presence of so many short-term renters has influenced their area's character and quality of living. On a Friday morning, three Haight residents — Dennis Hunt, Dan Langton and Patrick Kennedy — met at the 1428 Haight Cafe, as they've done for years. Each of the men has lived in the neighborhood for 16 years or longer; Langton, a Beat poet, has been in the area since the 1950s, when he bought a house facing Golden Gate Park for \$12,000. He still lives there. The other two, Hunt and Kennedy, have Airbnb hosts in neighboring homes, but their experiences have been polarizing. While Hunt said he doesn't mind the occasional guest in one unit of his multifamily apartment, Kennedy said that a Victorian nearby has been transformed into a full-time Airbnb capable of hosting more than a dozen people at once. (The neighborhood has only a few traditional hotels; most of the city's hotels are located downtown.) "One couple, whatever, is fine," Kennedy said. "When next door you have 16 people living in a Victorian, it's just like ..." he trailed off. The rise in Airbnbs, coupled with other forms of tourism and tech-worker commercial tastes, has sullied the neighborhood's character, Kennedy added. "People come here expecting it to be eclectic and it's not," he said. While Airbnb's presence in the Haight frustrates long-term residents like Kennedy, that's not for lack of consideration of the issue on the city's part. In 2015, responding to concerns that Airbnb was consuming large swaths of the long-term rental market by making it easier for landlords to convert their units to full-time hotels, the city passed a series of regulations on would-be leasers of short-term rental property. Gabrielle Lurie/The Chronicle Mayor London Breed was a district supervisor and then board president at the time, and her role in the regulatory process was mixed: She introduced legislation in 2016 that would have capped all short-term rentals at 60 days a year, but Mayor Ed Lee vetoed it; before that, she voted against other Airbnb regulations, including a proposition to block illegal listings. Under the current law, residents offering short-term rentals who live in the unit they are Airbnb'ing can rent it out an unlimited number of days. But their number of "unhosted stay" days — that is, the number of days they can rent out their property while they are not staying there — is capped at 90 days a year. Would-be short-term renters also need a business license and a short-term rental registration certificate. The regulations appear to be working, mostly. After they kicked in, Airbnb removed thousands of listings from its website, and most of the listings as of 2022 appear to be complying with the city's rules. Gabrielle Lurie/The Chronicle Diego Sanchez, manager at the city's Office of Short-Term Rentals, said that his department has approved about 1,550 applications for short-term rental certificates and received 830 additional applications, which remain open. According to the Inside Airbnb data, there are 1,803 unique host IDs tied to short-term listings in the city. This could mean that about 250 unlicensed short-term hosts are still operating, but it could be that most or all of them have already submitted applications, in which case it's unlikely the office would fine them or enforce the regulations, according to Sanchez. McGhie is a typical above-board operator, with a license and a unit that meets the qualifications for a short-term rental. She doesn't think the regulations are unduly restrictive — she actually helped inform them by appearing at Board of Supervisors meetings in the mid-2010s — though she does think they are part of the reason why the Haight is such an

Airbnb-heavy neighborhood. That’s a high concentration of Edwardian and Victorian-style homes, most of which are built with separate backyard entrances. The Airbnb operated on the garden level of a Haight-Ashbury home owned by Sara McGhie features a shared backyard, Gabrielle Lurie/The Chronicle “In my case, there is no kitchen there, it’s not a rentable unit. So Airbnb is a great way for me to have additional income and not have to put a kitchen in, because most people that come to San Francisco for three nights don’t really want to cook,” McGhie said. Other factors influencing the Haight’s popularity as an Airbnb destination, McGhie said, are its centralized location — it’s near other popular neighborhoods like Hayes Valley and the Castro, plus Golden Gate Park — and slightly reduced cost compared with even pricier areas like Russian Hill. (Its cultural history may not have as much of an impact, surprisingly: McGhie said relatively few of her guests know much about the neighborhood’s role in the hippie movement.) Her puppy, Teddy, looks on.Gabrielle Lurie/The Chronicle But while McGhie doesn’t find the regulations bothersome, other hosts in the neighborhood disagree — like Michael Lorton, who co-owns and operates an Airbnb with fellow host Young Choi in the basement of their Haight-Ashbury home. Lorton sees San Francisco’s Airbnb regulations as part of a larger battle between landlords and the city. The city imposes strict regulations on landlords, like rent control and eviction protections, which makes the long-term rental market less attractive. “Essentially every (San Francisco) landlord with a long-term rental would flee to short-term rental if he could,” he said. But when landlords tried to convert their rentals to short-term, the city blocked their efforts. The result, Lorton said, has been an overall reduction in the number of available rentals — both short- and long-term — that drives up prices for both types of housing. “The question is, how do you do a permanent hosted whole apartment?” Lorton said. “That’s what the city is fighting against.
